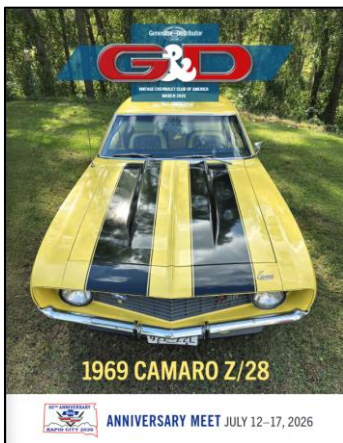

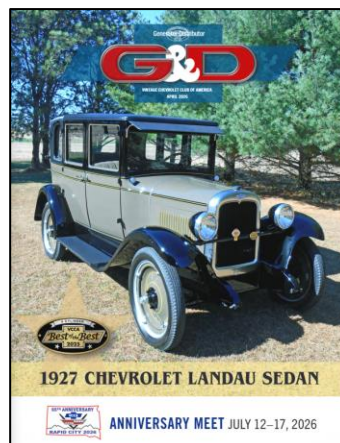


California's orange highway stripes are already changing how we drive

The late part of the 20th century brought about a host of retro based cars which made me think that my favorite classics might be returning. Unfortunately, introductions such as the Mazda Miata reminiscent of the Lotus Elan, the New VW Beetle, Ford's Eleventh Generation Thunderbird, Chrysler's PT Cruiser, Plymouth's Prowler, Fiat's 500, BMW's Mini Cooper and the return of the Ford GT left me uninspired or underfunded. Ford however did make a serious attempt to redesign the Fifth Generation Mustang in 2005 which executed many of the styling cues from the First Generation model. This resulted in a new pony car war in 2008 when Dodge reintroduced a Third Generation Challenger and Chevy reintroduced a Fifth Generation Camaro, both of which were based on their First Generation designs. Although these models had a limited shelf life and eventually lost appeal for various reasons; evidently the retro trend was not completely depleted, because recently new retro models continue to be created such as Jeep's Gladiator in 2019 and Ford's Bronco in 2021. In today's US market trucks/SUV's rule supreme.



Chevy has made other attempts to support the retro themed market by offering the SSR truck back in 2003 which was built for 4 model years and the HHR in 2005 offered with various window versions or a panel van, which evoked the spirit of the third generation Suburban. This was built for 6 model years. These were not well received as only one generation of each was produced and sales figures for the SSR were poor, while the HHR were only modest. These were novelty cars and neither did much to inspire a mass interest from the Chevy loyalists.



I've been longing for several years for Chevy to step up to the plate and bring back a model reminiscent of a mid 1960's car, which to me was the beginning of performance cars for the masses. What I've been imagining was a car that would echo the styling and name of a '66 Nova but with the spaciousness and elegance of an Impala. I wanted it to have good visibility, a bit of today's technology and capable of 5 seating passenger comfort.

Since I began reading about AI, I've heard it will lead to the apocalypse of technological advancement by creating fakes, fraud, and an existential risk to mankind. OK HAL, I hear you. From a creation point of view there is a lot to be gained with this enterprise. Just like any new technology if you can't or refuse to adopt it, there may be consequences such as loss of competitiveness, missed growth opportunities, and reduced efficiency. Here is where the technical part and fun of this article begins for me.

What I discovered since using [ChatGPT](#) was I could instruct it to create a vision, and after viewing the result, could revise any input parameters to align a design closer to what I was targeting. I began this process and over the duration of a week and 200+ training entries, created the images you see following. Initially I loaded some technical specs and verbal descriptions of the design style I wanted. There was a lot of trial and error before it would produce a version that looked right combined with the desired specs. The illustration below is the first iteration of the design it produced for me. Although I spec'd a modern retro car, the result was not what I had intended. I wanted modern features, specific limited technological advancements & marketability for this country.

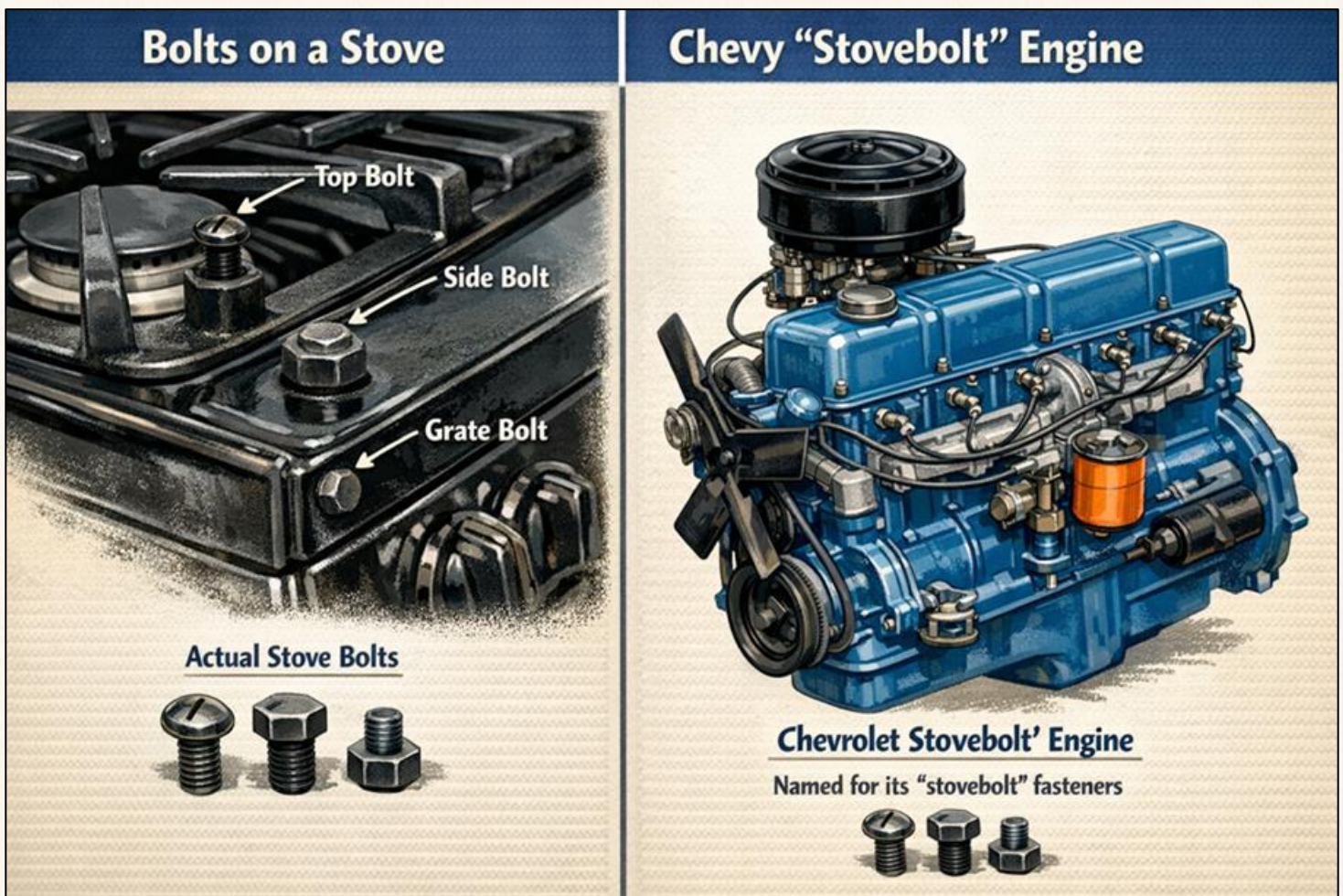

Why did they nickname the early 6-cylinder Chevy engine the “Stovebolt”?

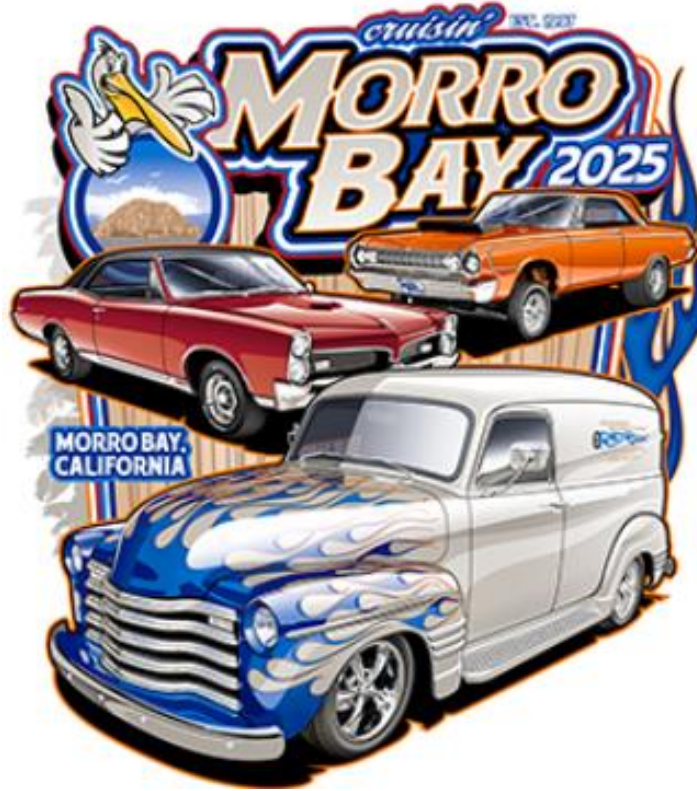
The Chevrolet engine was nicknamed "Stovebolt" because of the fasteners used to hold the engine together resembled the bolts used to assemble woodstoves. When Chevrolet introduced its inline six-cylinder engine in 1929, the fasteners used on the valve cover, lifter cover, oil pan and timing cover looked like these stovebolts, leading to the nickname.



Chevy Trivia Answer

Chevrolet first produced the inline 6, 3.2L (194 c.i.) in 1929 to gain a competitive edge over Ford during the 1920's-1930's. The last was supplied in 1990 for C/K Series trucks using the 4.1L (250 c.i.) or taller block deck of a 4.8L (292 c.i.) made in Mexico.
